



CHARLES "BUD" HAWKINS MEMORIAL

1944-2005

Charles "Bud" Hawkins was a teacher for the Ada Exempted Village Schools for twenty years. He enjoyed his students and served the district as not only teacher but also as a coach. He was a 1962 graduate of Upper Sandusky High School and a 1966 graduate of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. His love of history was evidenced by his Bachelor of Science Degree in Education in the certified areas of History, Government and Biological Science. He later earned his Master's Degree from the University of Dayton. Mr. Hawkins served three years in the United States Army, serving in the Viet Nam Republic and being honorably discharged with the rank of Captain.

In 1970 he joined the staff of North Union High School in Richwood, Ohio, teaching Civics, American History, World History, Sociology, Health and Economics. He also coached Basketball (junior high, junior varsity and Varsity Boys), Cross Country and Track and was a Senior Class Advisor.

Mr. Hawkins joined the Ada High School staff in 1978 and retired in 1998. While teaching at Ada, he taught O.W.A. as well as numerous history courses. He coached tennis, basketball (junior high boys, freshmen boys, varsity boys and varsity girls) and Cross Country.

Upon his retirement, Mr. Hawkins was a substitute teacher for the Ada Schools through the 2004-2005 school year. He succumbed to cancer on June 1, 2005.

Mr. Hawkins loved history. His wife, Sharon, and children, Jason and Jenny, are proud to offer this memorial in his name. The family would like to assist a graduating AHS Senior who desires to become a teacher. The only criteria for applying for this memorial is that the graduating senior plans to earn a degree in the field of Education.

*Applications must be completed and returned to the Ada High School Guidance Office by **April 1st**. The applications will be reviewed by the Hawkins Family and Ada Lions Club Scholarship Committee of which Mr. Hawkins was an active member for many years. The memorial award will be presented at the Senior Honors Banquet in May.*
